CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS

JOURNAL OF CAMPUS BEHAVIORAL INTERVENTION

The National Behavioral Intervention Team Association (www.nabita.org) will publish the fourth volume of its peer-reviewed academic journal, *The Journal of Campus Behavioral Intervention (J-BIT)* in November 2016. *J-BIT* is intended to encourage academic research and scholarship regarding the function, design, operation, and assessment of campus Behavioral Intervention Teams (BITs) at two- and four-year colleges and universities. Published articles undergo extensive review by top BIT scholars and practitioners on the editorial board.

***J-BIT* is a multi-disciplinary journal; the only limitation on subjects is that articles must relate to campus BIT concerns. Articles fall into one of these four categories:**

- ***Threat Assessment*** articles may include information related to direct communicated threats, threat assessment strategies and theory, social media threats, workplace violence, new practices in assessment, application to specific populations (e.g., law enforcement, student conduct, counseling, and residential life), and violence risk factors.
- ***Case Study*** manuscripts should facilitate dialogue among those practicing behavioral intervention and illustrate important aspects of BIT functioning. Case studies that encourage discussion among BIT members and advance communication are preferred.
- ***Research*** submissions should explore issues related to BIT development, advertising, evaluation, and/or operations. Manuscripts may include survey data, reviews of current practice, and meta-analysis of multiple BITs, as well as more traditional quantitative or qualitative analysis of current practice or BIT operation as it applies to special populations.
- ***Innovative Practice*** submissions may include issues related to team formation, advertising, team leadership and size, team scope (e.g., student/faculty/staff), record-keeping and documentation, case management, budget and funding, and referral source development.
